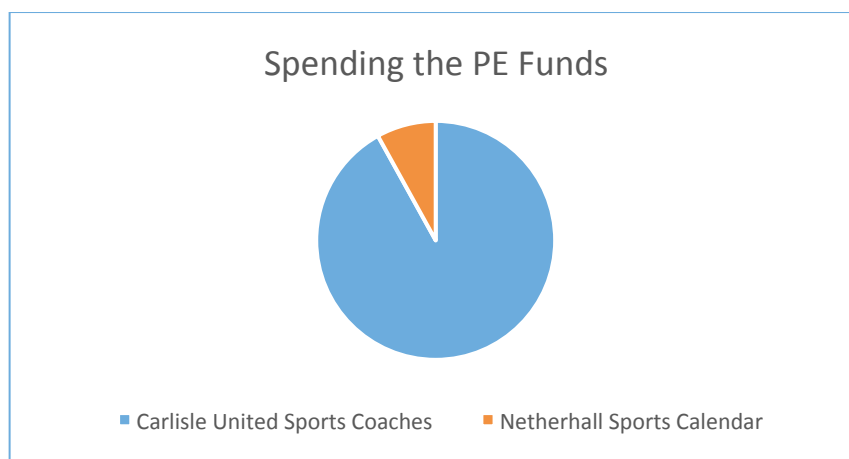


PE Funding – 2015/2016

Again we have been very lucky and have been provided with some extra sports funding from the government to spend across the year.

Every school is receiving this extra money in order to improve the delivery of and facilities for PE.

In 2015-2016 we had a total of £9,322 to spend on PE (this included some carry forward from previous financial years).

Impact of Sports Premium Budget 2015/2016

- Increased number of children participating in a wide variety of sport activities, delivered by Carlisle United Sports in the Community Coaches and Allerdale Sports Coaches.
- More teams involved in inter school competitions
- All children could swim 10 metres at the end of Y6
- Staff report greater confidence in teaching a wider range of sports
- Children have access to a wider range of sports than previously

Pupil voice

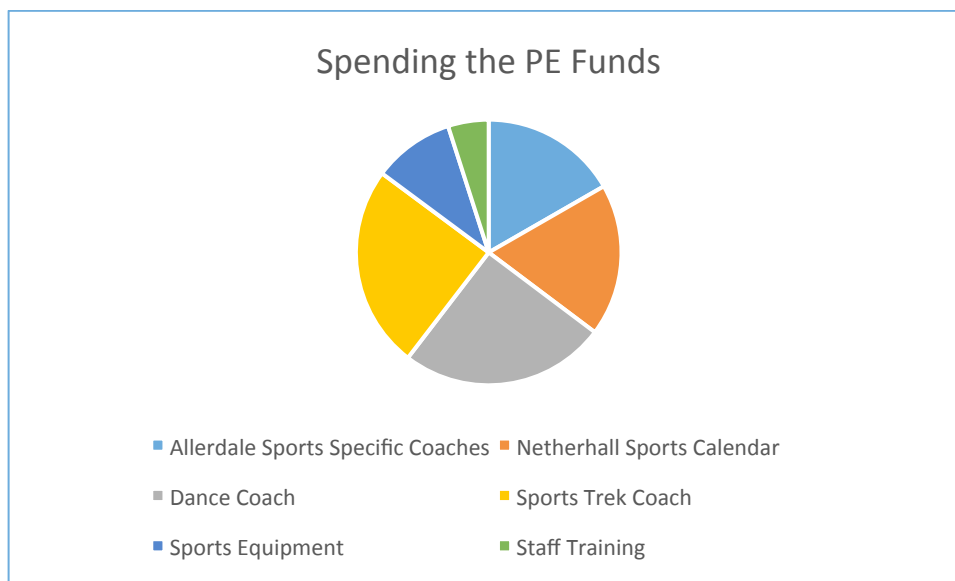
- 91% of children said they enjoyed playing sport at St Gregory's
- 90% of children said that sport at St. Gregory's helped support them in staying healthy and fit
- 81% of children said that sport at St Gregory's helps them develop their skills across a range of sports.
- 88% of children enjoy sports day.

Additional information

- In addition to the sports premium school pays for children in key stage 2 to access swimming. This leads to an increased number of children being able to swim by Year 6. In 2016 100% of children in Y6 could swim at least 10 metres.
